



There are many Trusts functioning under the name of 'Sri Sathya Sai Trust (Name of the state)'. In six of these Trusts functioning in the states of Bihar, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana & Chandigarh, Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka, the Central Trust has powers to nominate the trustees. In all the other State Trusts, new trustees are appointed by the existing trustees. There are some Sai Trusts and Foundations functioning overseas which are independent bodies and the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust has no legal connection with them though all are connected through the Divine inspiration of Bhagawan Baba.

All contributions to the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust are voluntary from individuals who witness Bhagawan Baba's various projects being executed efficiently, their positive impact on beneficiaries and their providing relief to a large number of people. Report of Activities 2021-22



Releasing of Annual Report of Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust 2020-21, on the occasion of Bhagawan's 96th Birthday Celebrations

The year under review saw the world slowly returning to normalcy post-pandemic. Travel restrictions were removed, and the Prasanthi Nilayam Ashram too began preparing to reopen for pilgrims. Though the canteens and accommodation facility in the Ashram was formally opened for all on April 02, 2022, through the year under review the Ashram was open only partially, but all events and festivals observed in Sai Kulwant Hall were held as per the COVID protocols applicable. The focus was on dealing effectively with the impact of the pandemic and offering medical support to the local populace.

The Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust (SSSCT) is a unique institution. It is a public charitable Trust whose objectives are service to the needy, through activities in the fields of health, education and public utility. Bhagawan has set up landmark institutions and projects with very innovative models for efficient functioning and effective utilisation of resources. The Trustees have been ensuring that these continue to work in the same efficient manner, in the same spirit of inspiration and dedication. There were five Board meetings between Apr 01, 2021 and Mar 31, 2022.

The 125 bedded COVID facility at Puttaparthi and the COVID wards at the Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences, Whitefield continued their service to society. The COVID pandemic had created

a need for hospitals to be self-sufficient with regards to Medical Oxygen and the Trust was quick to equip both the Super Speciality Hospitals with the equipment needed to generate oxygen. A DOCS 500 oxygen generation plant was set up at SSSIHMS, Puttaparthi to cater to the COVID Hospital and the Super Speciality Hospital, and a DOCS 200 was set up at the hospital at Whitefield. These plants will meet close to 90% of the oxygen required for patients during surgeries and in post-operative ICU care.

The Trust also procured and commissioned an Advanced Cardiac Life Support Ambulance. It is a state-of-the-art, fully air-conditioned, moving cardiac care unit to be used to transport critically ill patients safely from one medical centre to another.

The Trust continued its support to all other allied institutions too with timely upgradation of facilities, manpower and equipment to ensure the smooth functioning as per the mission of the institutions.

Special efforts were made to ensure devotees are able to stay connected virtually to Prasanthi as the world was still slowly returning to normalcy after the lockdowns. Arrangements were made so devotees could have the live darshan on Thursdays and Sundays through the official YouTube and Facebook pages. The Sri Sathya Sai Official YouTube channel and the Sri Sathya Sai Bhajans YouTube channel both crossed the remarkable figure of a 100 million

views each as devotees used these as means to stay connected and positive through the pandemic. Timely updates of happenings in Prasanthi Nilayam, notifications regarding opening of the mandir and restrictions if any, were all shared through the various official Social Media channels. This way, devotees from across the world received authentic information directly from the Trust.

A week-long In-Service training program for Officers of All India Service (IAS, IPS and IFoS) and Officers working under the Central Staffing Scheme in the Govt. of India was conducted in Prasanthi Nilayam in Jan 2022. The program titled “Human Values in Governance and Public Policy” conducted by SSSCHV and attended by senior officers from various states.

The Trust also launched the Sri Sathya Sai Inclusive Education Project at an outlay of ₹5.6 crores. Meant to benefit the vast section of differently abled children of India, the project owes its mandate to the Government of India, which requested the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust to initiate the campaign based on the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The project will be executed in 3 phases over nine years, absolutely free of cost, universally accessible to all students through the Government of India portal Diksha. The schools in Prasanthi Nilayam were provided with Smart Boards and Tablets to Sai Schools throughout the country.

Upgradation of rooms given to devotees were taken up including provision of lifts in the buildings. Sai Charan, facility for elderly was renovated. The Shanthi Bhavan accommodation was improved. A staff quarters in Brindavan, Bengaluru was approved.

To provide immediate relief to the marginalised sections of society in the rural areas of Anantapur district (devadasis) who have been finding it difficult to cope and survive during the pandemic times, the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust sent them a gift hamper of essential food supplies like 25 kilos of rice, 2 kilos

of wheat flour, 1 litre of oil, 1 kilo of pulses, etc. along with a saree and Bhagawan’s vibhuti and photo. The Trust approved renovation of a community hall at Brahmanapalli Thanda. In the state of Odisha, 16 drinking water plants were approved to benefit the needy in the Nuapada and Jagatsinghpur districts.

The Trust has also been constantly supporting and collaborating with SSSSO for various service projects and has been taking initiatives to improve facilities for the Sevalal who come from across the country to serve Bhagawan at Prasanthi Nilayam. The Ladies Sevalal Block in the Ashram was refurbished in Mar 2022. The entire building is now powered with Solar Energy, new lockers were provided, and washrooms have been completely renovated. Automatic and manual sanitary napkins vending machine have also been installed. Sri Sathya Sai Lakshmi Narayana Swamy Skill Development Training Centre at Tadipatri was established in Nov 2014. It has been training poor students to equip them with the means to earn a livelihood. So far 17 batches (150 students) have completed their training here. The Trust has provided financial support to the vocational training centre, to the tune of ₹ 20 Lakhs to expand its activities and to introduce new courses for the benefit of rural youth.

Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vihar school, Ramakrishnapuram branch at Palasa, Srikakulam was set up on Nov 23, 2014. It is a boarding school which is home to over 250 students and faculty members that runs in line with Swami’s principles of holistic, value-based education. This year the Trust granted ₹ 42 Lakhs to the Sri Sathya Sai Trust, AP to help improve the infrastructure of the school. Over the years, the Trust has donated ₹ 1.64 Crores for the development of the school.

In November 2021, Puttaparthi witnessed heavy rainfalls leading to the overflowing of River Chitravati and the waterbody in Bukkapatnam. This led to flash floods in low lying areas in and around Puttaparthi. The Trust was quick to help the local populace with food and other assistance. The

food was specially prepared in the Ashram and was distributed to the affected with the help of SSSSO-India. Also blankets were distributed to the school students in and around Puttaparthi.

A state-of-the-art modern crematorium facility was dedicated to the Puttaparthi Nagar Panchayat by the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust on Sep 30, 2021. The LPG based Crematorium, Amardham, is a facility spread over two acres and has been created to cater to the needs of all communities. The project that was commenced with Bhagawan's blessings in 2020, is fully equipped with waiting halls, separate bath facilities for men and women, an office, staff quarters and record rooms, and special rooms to carry out rituals. In line with the other green initiatives of the Trust, the crematorium has been equipped with a system to ensure zero air and water pollution.

The medical needs of all employees of the Trust and their families are taken care of at the hospitals set up by Bhagawan. For other treatments that may be necessary sometimes, the Trust has now offered a Group Mediclaim Policy for the eligible employees of SSSCT. It was also decided that 80% of the premium would be borne by the Trust and 20% by the employees. This policy is applicable to employees in the age group of 18 – 65 years.

The Sri Sathya Sai Global Council (SSSGC) was established with the objectives, To unify, To strengthen, and To expand, "Sri Sathya Sai Organisations" globally and firmly establish their connection with the sacred Abode of Peace, Prasanthi Nilayam with greater coordination and cooperation as directed by Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba. The SSSGC will provide a platform to harmonize the strengths, ideas, and initiatives of all Sai organisations founded, nurtured, and guided by Bhagawan and draw support from each other's strengths to reach out to humanity through seva and intensify sadhana of every office bearer and participating devotee. The SSSGC was officially dedicated at Bhagawan's feet on the auspicious occasion of Guru Poornima on Jul 24, 2021.

Sri Sathya Sai Divyasmṛti, a unique digital experience centre, located in the Brindavan ashram in Bengaluru was set up by the Trust with an outlay of approximately ₹ 5 Crores. In the Board of Trustees meeting held on Jun 06, 2021 Sri S Sundar (Director, SSSMC) was appointed as the Convener of the museum committee that would oversee the completion of the project. (It was inaugurated on Nov 03, 2022 and open to public). Much of the work related to the digital museum was completed in the year under review.

The construction of the Convention Centre at Prasanthi Nilayam is nearing completion and is likely to be inaugurated in Feb 2023. The approximate area of the building is 50,000 sq. ft. It has 2 auditoria, a 300-seater & a 1000-seater, and 2 conference halls.

In a very heartening development for devotees across the globe, the State Government of Andhra Pradesh announced the formation of the Sri Sathya Sai District with Puttaparthi as its headquarters as India celebrated the 73rd Republic Day. The Trust gratefully acknowledged this gesture of the State Government to recognise the yeomen contribution of Bhagawan and also extended the necessary support for the setting up of the necessary offices for the newly formed district.

The Trust was honoured this year with the YSR Lifetime Achievement award, instituted in memory of the former Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, the late Dr YS Rajasekhara Reddy. The award was presented in a ceremony held at Vijayawada on the occasion of the Andhra Pradesh State formation day on Nov 01, 2021. This award was handed over by the Hon'ble Governor of Andhra Pradesh Sri Biswabhusan Harichandan and the Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh Sri Y S Jagan Mohan Reddy, to the Managing Trustee Sri R J Rathnakar. The Trust was recognised for its yeomen service to the people of the state.



Compliance & Social Impact

Compliance:

Compliance: Our books of accounts are regularly audited by an eminent firm of auditors. Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust has consistently adhered to procedures of regulatory compliance required by various departments of the government. The Trust files income tax returns every year and responds promptly to any follow-up queries by the Income Tax Department. Reports required under Foreign Contribution Regulation Act, 1976 are regularly submitted to the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India. The Trust has been filing a copy of the annual financial statements along with this statement giving details of additions / deletions to the assets of the Trust, with the Assistant Commissioner of Endowments,

Anantapur every year as per subsection 10 of section 43 of the Andhra Pradesh Charitable & Hindu Religious Institutions and Endowments Act, 1987. The Trust has been prompt and timely in its history of compliance.

Social Impact: In the last couple of years, Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust has installed rooftop solar power panels in a conscious move towards green sources of power. These solar panels have been installed at the two super-speciality hospitals, the hostels of the educational institutions in Prasanthi Nilayam campus, and on various building in the ashram. This has led to a saving of ₹ 15.28 crores in electricity bills.

Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences, Prasanthigram

The Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust has been offering free medical care to the needy through two General Hospitals and two Super-speciality Hospitals. The Trust also runs, as part of the medical outreach program, a Mobile Hospital. During the current year, the benefit to society through medical costs saved by patients treated at the two Super-speciality Hospitals is estimated at ₹ 188.5 Crores (computed at CGHS rates), and since inception the amount is a staggering ₹ 3,282.7 Crores. If the market cost of treatment at hospitals of comparable level of sophistication in equipment and medical services were to be considered, the savings realized would be far higher than these figures.

Similarly, the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust runs educational institutions from primary and secondary levels to undergraduate and post graduate courses and Ph.D. degrees, providing contemporary and quality academic programs with value orientation. This again is totally free to the students. The total number of students studying in all these institutions together is 3,964 (2,520 in schools and 1,444 in University). In addition, the Trust supports schools run by SSSSO India in different parts of the country.



Sociocare

Solar Power Plants:

Through the Sri Sathya Sai Mitra project, the Trust has taken a huge initiative towards powering the Institutions through Solar Power moving away from conventional energy sources. Since 2018, under Phase 1, Phase 2 and Phase 3 of the project, solar plants of 6.24MWp capacity were installed in all by the Trust at an approximate cost of ₹ 27 crores.

As of March 2022, these plants have generated 270 lakh units of green power leading to a saving of ₹ 15.28 crores in electricity bills. The plants installed in Phase 1 have paid back the initial investment made in setting up.



Solar Water Heaters:

Solar-cum-heat pump based water heating systems have been provided for the school hostels at Prasanthi Nilayam.

Water Conservation:

The water conservation efforts through rainwater harvesting measures have borne fruit as the borewells have got recharged as a result of the increase in the water table. Sewage Treatment Plants are being used to reduce the use of freshwater for gardening. The augmentation of these plants is being pursued with superior technologies.

The sewage treatment plants continue to conserve water by treating sewage in all the campuses of the Trust.



Amenities in the Ashram

Lifts for buildings – During the year few more lifts were provided for the various buildings at Prasanthi Nilayam to improve accessibility for all visitors and residents.

Sai Charan – A dormitory was renovated and furnished for the senior citizens of the Ashram who need constant support and care.

Renovation of North Blocks – The renovation of North 7 was completed for the comfort of the visitors.

The railings of various buildings of the Ashram have been raised for added safety. Small gates are provided at staircases to prevent the entry of stray dogs.



New Constructions/Renovations

- Waterproofing of the school and hostel buildings has been taken up.
- The polycarbonate sheet of the Sai Kulwant Hall has been replaced with Palram sheets from Israel and the waterproofing of Sai Kulwant Hall done using Insuwrap from Saudi Arabia. The PA system has been repositioned for a better experience for devotees.
- Convention Centre – The construction of the Convention centre is nearing completion. The approximate area of the building is 50,000 sq.ft. It has two auditoria, one a 300-seater & another a 1000-seater, and two conference halls. The transformer is in position and a solar plant of 220kWp has been installed on the Kalzip roof of the convention centre, making it generate its own power requirement.
- Sri Sathya Sai Divyasmṛti – A Digital Experience Centre based on the life and teachings of Bhagawan Baba has been set up at the Brindavan Ashram, Bengaluru.
- Sri Sathya Sai Centre for Human Values – Additional space has been provided for the SSSCHV by renovating the space on the first floor of the western canteen.
- BLDC fans are being provided in dormitories as part of energy conservation measures. These fans consume half the power as normal fans.
- Fire Protection systems have been augmented at the Sri Sathya Sai General Hospital, Prasanthi Nilayam.
- The painting of the interiors of the educational institutions in Prasanthi Nilayam has been taken up.
- Renovation and re-roofing of Poornachandra Hall was taken up during the year under review and is scheduled to be completed by early 2023.



Activities Taken Up Outside Prasanthi Nilayam

Dharwad – The extension of the school, college and hostel have been completed and a few additional facilities like fire escape staircases and sports stadium built.



Brindavan – The college building has been provided with plinth protection and waterproofing done with Insuwarp (Saudi Arabia). The college auditorium was renovated with new interiors and the asbestos roof was replaced with PUFF sheets.



Anantapur – All the asbestos sheets in the Anantapur Campus, SSSIHL have been replaced with PUFF sheets. The BT roads of the campus have been provided with an asphalt overlay.

Kerala – The construction of Anganwadis has been initiated in the flood-affected districts of Alappuzha.

Odisha – The Trust has initiated the process of setting up 16 drinking water plants in the state of Odisha.

Introduction

In recent years, several advances have been made in the fields of Medical Sciences and Technology. While medical facilities have increased manifold, the prohibitive cost of quality healthcare (being highly capital and skill intensive) has taken many of these Life-saving measures out of the reach of the common man. In response to this situation, Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba set up hospitals to provide highest level of healthcare to all patients free of all charges.

The Sri Sathya Sai Hospitals perform thousands of advanced surgeries each year totally free of cost without any discrimination of caste, creed or economic status. Nearly 66% of the patients treated at the two super-speciality hospitals are those whose family annual income is less than ₹ 30,000 p.a. In this way, they bring a smile to the faces of economically distressed section of the masses for whom access to quality healthcare would have otherwise remained a distant dream.

Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences, Prasanthigram

The Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences (SSSIHMS), Prasanthigram, Puttaparthi continue to maintain high standards of patient care by providing completely free treatment to all in-patients and out-patients irrespective of caste, creed, race, religion, ethnicity and nationality. The completely free treatment includes diagnosis, surgery, interventions, medicines and diet.

During the past year, 1,65,018 outpatient consultations were performed.

During the year under review, 5,722 surgeries and procedures were carried out by the departments of CTVS, Cardiology, Urology, Plastic Surgery, Ophthalmology and Orthopaedics put together and 2,25,150 diagnostics tests were performed.

New Equipment and Facilities

New Oxygen Generation Plant

With the blessings of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba the new oxygen generation plant was inaugurated at the Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences, Prasanthigram. The

plant was inaugurated by Sri R J Rathnakar, the Managing Trustee of SSSCT, in the presence of Dr Gurusurthy, the Director of SSSIHMS, Prasanthigram, and other senior staff members of the hospital.

Initially, the plant was set up in view of the approaching Covid-19 third wave but is being currently used to cater to the regular patients of the hospital. The plant has been set up at the cost of ₹ 90 lakh. The oxygen plant can produce 500 litres of oxygen per minute and as such will make the hospital self-reliant on oxygen once the covid-19 cases cease. The machine takes in atmospheric air and produces medical-grade oxygen. Nitrogen and other atmospheric gases escape through the exhaust back into the atmosphere. This oxygen generation plant offers a cost-effective, reliable and safe alternative to conventional oxygen gas plants. The machine uses a unique and proprietary Vacuum Swing Adsorption (VSA) process that eliminates many of the design problems associated with other commercial systems. It is also equipped with Variable Speed Drives (VSDs) to conserve electrical power at lower consumption requirements.

RIRS with Laser Lithotripsy Procedure

The hospital in the past year added the RIRS with Laser Lithotripsy setup to the treatment procedures of stone disease of the Urology department. In this procedure, the stone is approached using a flexible ureteroscope and once the stone is localised it is shifted into a favourable location and then a laser is used to powder it. This procedure causes minimum morbidity and requires minimum post-operative care and hence has reduced hospital stay.

Academics

The SSSIHMS, Prasanthigram had a stellar performance in academics with the hospital securing two All India Gold Medals in the specialities of Cardio Thoracic Vascular Surgery and Urology by Dr Yogi Chaganti and Dr Anuj Dumra respectively. They both credited the Grace of Bhagawan Baba, and the unmatched training provided by the SSSIHMS for their success.

As on Mar 31, 2022, 40 postgraduate students were undergoing training to pass the All-India examination to qualify for obtaining the certificate of Diplomate of National Board in various disciplines approved by the National Board of Examinations, New Delhi, which also includes super-specialities in medical sciences viz., Cardio Thoracic and vascular surgery, Cardiology, and Urology and sub-specialities of Ophthalmology, Anaesthesiology and Orthopaedics.

Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences, Whitefield (Bengaluru)

Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences, Whitefield (Bengaluru) a 333-bedded super speciality hospital continues its service to society offering the best medical care to patients from across the country and abroad. During the last year, the institution saw nearly 49,000 patients in the super-speciality departments of Cardiac Sciences and Neurosciences, performing more than 3925 surgeries/procedures. This was despite the second wave of COVID pandemic which devastated the world at large. Since its inception, the hospital has performed 1,26,287 surgeries/procedures and has provided over 16,18,485 outpatient consultations. The approximate value of services provided by the institution is to the tune of ₹3,759 crores.

The hospital upgraded its infrastructure in terms of equipment like the state-of-the-art Echocardiography machine Vivid E95 R3 from M/s GE Healthcare capable of performing 3D echocardiography and GE treadmill for Cardiology, Bulk oxygen generator to fulfil the oxygen requirement of the hospital, Advanced patient monitoring systems consisting of 12 high-end monitors from M/s Nihon Khoden, 4 advanced GE R860 Ventilators M/s GE Healthcare, 2 high-end Servo Air Ventilators from M/s Maquet and Temperature control machines in Cardiac Surgery, upgrade of GE HD 750 CT Scanner to its latest version, upgrade of Siemens MAGNETOM AERA 1.5T MRI machine to its latest version in Radiology, HbA1c analyzer for Lab, Soring Ultrasonic Aspirator and 4 advanced GE R860 Ventilators M/s GE Healthcare for Neurosurgery. The fire prevention and fire-fighting system were upgraded to meet the current regulations.

On the academic front too, the hospital had lots to cheer about. In recognition of the excellent instruction provided by the doctors of our hospital, the National Board of Examinations has selected SSSIHMS, Whitefield as a DNB Examination centre for Cardiology, Cardiac

Surgery and Anaesthesia. The doctors of the hospital have made presentations at several National and International conferences, and have also conducted conferences at the hospital for the benefit of post-graduates in Cardiology and Cardiac Surgery.

Sri Sathya Sai General Hospital, Whitefield (Bengaluru)

This 80-bed general hospital is operated through a unique model that involves significant volunteering by honorary doctors along with in-house doctors. Nearly 1850 surgeries were performed and more than, 70 000 patients received treatment in the previous year.

The ENT department upgraded its diagnostic facility consisting of rigid telescopes with a viewing system to carry out endoscopic diagnostics at the OPD.

The Ophthalmology department upgraded its diagnostic equipment such as Fundus Camera, Optical Coherence Tomography (OCT) from M/s Topcon, Auto-Refractometer/Auto Keratometer (ARK) from SHIN NIPPON for patient care in the outpatient area.

Apart from regular surgeries, major laparoscopic surgeries are now being carried out at SSSGH-Whitefield. With laparoscopic work, the average surgical and medical cost is significantly reduced.

Covid care at SSSIHMS, Whitefield

The devastating second wave of COVID crippled the infrastructure of the country in the months of April and May 2021, causing panic amidst shortage of oxygen beds. With the Blessings of Bhagawan, Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust, directed the hospital to start a full-fledged COVID ward with 80 oxygen beds and 10 COVID ICU beds. Close

to 250 patients were treated during the second wave of COVID and entire hospital staff came forward to provide support for the COVID ward. The doctors and nurses from all departments came forward and donned COVID suits to help the desperate patients to recover from the illness.

Sri Sathya Sai General Hospital, Prasanthi Nilayam

Sri Sathya Sai General Hospital is the first medical institution started by Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba in 1956. It serves a population of 5 lakhs. The patients are drawn from the different mandals of Sri Sathya Sai district.

The special service rendered for COVID patients by joining hands with Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences continued in the first quarter of the year.

From July the regular services in the hospital resumed. The special areas of service are

- Obstetrics and Gynecology – 150 deliveries are conducted every month. Out of which 30% – 40% are cesarean section.
- Pediatrics with Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU).
- Medicine (including emergency medicine).
- ENT with audiology clinic.
- Dentistry with 3 fully equipped chairs doing all procedures.

A number of visiting doctors from both India and abroad render service for varying periods.

Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Hospital, Prasanthi Nilayam

Owing to the Covid pandemic and the associated lockdown, the services of the SSS Mobile Hospital had to be withdrawn and resumed only in April 2022. But the Doctors of the Mobile Hospital were worried about a subset of patients categorised “CD” (Chronic Disease) who need uninterrupted monitoring and supply of medicines.

Hence, a special section was opened in the Sri Sathya Sai General Hospital which would act as a common point for the CD Patients to be seen and treated. In this way, every month on the same day as the SSS Mobile Hospital functions

(1st to 12th of the month), the section in the General Hospital was active and took care of the CD patients. Around 1000 patients every month got the benefit of consultation, investigation and medicines, to cover one full month. For those who could not come during a particular month, their medicines were handed over to the villagers of the same village since excellent records of all the CD patients are duly maintained. This proved to be a very innovative and useful way of treating the CD patients who cannot afford to stop the use of medicines, as it would cause rebound effect and complications.




Introduction

The Sri Sathya Sai Media Centre (SSSMC) began its journey as Radio Sai Global Harmony, a satellite radio service in 2001 when Bhagawan launched it during His birthday celebration.



10th Anniversary of Telugu Stream

The Telugu Stream celebrated its 10th Anniversary in July 2021 through a weeklong offering of programs online. From July 25 – 31, 2021 special programs by children, elders, and students from Bhagawan’s schools and colleges were streamed on Sri Sathya Sai Sandesha Jhari YouTube Channel, both in the mornings and evenings.



New Initiatives

- Through the pandemic, SSSMC produced many programs to help devotees from across the globe connect with Bhagawan. Live darshan of the Mahasannidhi was offered on Sundays and Thursdays in addition to program and festival days. Special Satsangs, Panel Discussions and Festival Programs were offered on various YouTube channels, in English, Telugu, Hindi, Tamil and Kannada during Thursdays and festivals.
- Audio programs that were earlier broadcast on Radio Sai and were well received by listeners were made available as podcasts on popular services such as Spotify, Amazon Music, Apple Music, Google Music, Gaana, Hungama, Anchor and so on.
- Programs of SSSMC, Swami's discourses, Sai Bhajans and Live broadcasts from the Sai Kulwant hall were made available on Amazon Fire TV OTT Platform.
- These programs and more can now also be accessed using voice commands through Virtual Voice Assistant – Alexa.





- On Maha Shivaratri day, Mar 01, 2022, SSSMC launched the Prasanthi Connect mobile App. This mobile App, which is now available in the Google Play store and the Apple App Store, helps users access all the videos broadcast live from Prasanthi Nilayam and produced by the Sri Sathya Sai Media Centre.
- SSSMC worked extensively on the content for the Sri Sathya Sai Divyasmṛti, a digital experience centre being set up in Brindavan (was inaugurated on Nov 03, 2022). All the audio recordings, in English, Hindi, Telugu and Kannada were completely done at the studios in Prasanthi Nilayam. All videos that involve restored archival footage were scripted and edited by the Media Centre. Much of the content was also prepared by the Media Centre.
- A new audio-visual console was constructed and deployed at the Sai Kulwant Hall to aid in the handling of the PA system and video unit during bhajans and other programs. A separate cabin for audio and video units, both completely soundproof, was built to improve their functionality and utility. The cabling in the Sai Kulwant hall was also completely redone. Trenches were made and all electrical cables, fibre lines and signal cables were re-laid to reduce clutter in the Mandir and to improve the functionality of the audio-visual systems.






Integral Education For All, By All

The Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini program is one of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba's living legacies to guide the education of future generations. The program marks its 12th anniversary in November 2022.

After setting up India's top schools and university campuses in and around Prasanthi Nilayam, in His infinite wisdom, the Universal teacher to humanity, Bhagawan Baba decided to extend the advantages of Sai education to children everywhere. This was to bridge the numeracy and literacy gaps between rural and urban children, while giving them a chance to develop sound character. To achieve this end, He set up SSSVV as the digital platform. The project is digitally powered and empowers teachers everywhere through high-quality content, training, teaching aids and much more.




Contents

Close to 120 content authors, mentors and reviewers along with approximately 60 multimedia experts around the world are engaged in creating content. The content creation process is currently in progress for class 9 (Science, Maths, Social Studies), class 6 to 8 Social Studies for state boards, class 3 (English Grammar) and class 5 (EVS) for a few state boards. There has been an impressive addition of 395 Master Lesson Plans (MLPs) to the content repository between Nov 2021 and Oct 2022. The total number of SSSVV digital assets currently stand at an impressive 32,700 and are being completed at an average rate of 1 MLP per day.

The MLPs have qualitative upgrades in the form of TLMs (Teaching Learning Materials) and ITT (Innovative Teaching Techniques). A small team has been working on creating TLMs for the chapters already on LMS. While the TLMs for the existing MLPs were added as a separate component in the LMS for teachers' reference, the newer MLPs have them as a part of the asset document. At least one asset in every MLP created in the past six months has used ITT.

Feedback Redressal: Feedback given by the schools after using SSSVV content for the academic year 2021 – 2022 has been categorised into two – ‘actionable’ and ‘enrichment’. A common response has been sent out to schools to acknowledge their inputs and a small team has been constituted to address actionable feedback.

Quiz Package: A global corporation created about 60,000 quiz questions as a part of its CSR in 2021. The content team engaged with 7 schools and over 200 teachers for getting these questions reviewed for accuracy and appropriateness of questioning technique. These questions are being converted into an interactive format and uploaded on LMS.

Training

This year a new online weekly training series TATVAM (**T**alk **A**nalyze **T**rain **V**alidate **A**ffirm **M**entor) commenced to constantly engage with Trainers and Mentors pan India. This ensures that the central team is in touch with all the trainers and mentors, and is constantly striving to better serve our school teachers.





◇ **Support to other Verticals**

- Support is provided to other verticals as and when required for conducting their team training programs either online/offline or in a hybrid format.

Phone-Your-Friend (PYF)

The Phone-Your-Friend initiative of SSSVV, which is conducted as a 5-course programme, has been helping innumerable teachers from Sri Sathya Sai Schools, Balavikas gurus and Sai youth from Sathya Sai Centres improve their English language proficiency. In order to make this offering available to a larger section of beneficiaries, the 'SainIn - the English App' was dedicated at the lotus feet of the Lord on Gurupoornima Day, 2021. Currently, there are 648 mentors actively training learners both through the regular phone-in programme and the app. There are 795 beneficiaries across the country engaged in English language learning.



SSSVV Teaching Aids

Due to Covid related restrictions, only multimedia aids were shared with all the school teachers, as well as Lenovo Tablets to enable convenient access to SSSVV digital teaching resources.

- **SSSVV's Multimedia (MM)** team has expanded across the globe to 64 members. Regular training is conducted once in 6 months to induct new volunteers into the MM team. The training consists of 5 modules (SSSVV Practical Framework, SSSVV Pedagogy, Introduction to Copyright, Customising Features of MS PowerPoint and Cognitive Load Theory in educational multimedia aids design) which the volunteers complete over a period of 4 weeks. In 2022, a total of 49 volunteers would have completed this course.
- **Multimedia Aids:** There has been an impressive addition of 4500+ multimedia aids in the form of audio, video, animation

and presentation to the classroom content repository between November 2021 and October 2022. During the same period around 500+ audio-visuals were created for training, awareness and other internal and external communications.

- **Interactive Quizzes in LMS:** A massive effort is in progress for converting 60,000 quizzes created by a global corporation into Interactive Quizzes on SSSVV-LMS Platform. These quizzes are for all the chapters of Mathematics, EVS, Science and Social Studies from 1st to 8th standard across 4 State boards and CBSE.



SSSVV Inclusive Education Project

Inclusive Education

The New Education Policy – NEP 2020 envisions making every school in India Inclusive by 2030. The Sustainable Development Goals – 2030 of UNESCO envisages the same. NEP 2020 provides a framework for migrating from physical inclusion to holistic inclusion.


Every child should be able to learn in an inclusive setup despite the challenges they may have. Everybody's needs should be addressed in the same classroom without making compromises in learning. With Bhagawan's immense grace and blessings, SSSVV has been blessed with the opportunity to contribute towards this noble goal as per the requirements of the New Education Policy – 2020. This project aims to improve the lives of special children and their families.

Soon after SSSVV content for CBSE Grades 1–8 was published on diksha.gov.in, a request was received from the Ministry of Education (MoE) to provide

Content for Inclusive Education. In October 2020, SSSVV presented to the MoE a project proposal which was very much appreciated and approved by NCERT and MoE. Thereafter, SSSVV designed and constructed the Framework, Pedagogical approaches using the Universal Design of Learning, Curriculum requirements, Guidelines and Review Rubrics. All these were presented to the Subject Matter Experts of NCERT and officials of the MoE. These were reviewed and approved by them. Based on these parameters, prototypes are currently being developed.

With the immense grace and blessings of Bhagawan, the project was inaugurated in Sai Kulwant Hall on the auspicious day of Sankranti, Jan 14, 2022.

The SSSCT signed a historic Memorandum of Agreement with the Govt. of India to deliver this project in the service of the nation in 3 phases by 2030.



Total Play Time (Hours)



Sri Sathya Sai Centre for Human Values

The Sri Sathya Sai Centre for Human Values (SSSCHV) was established as a body that shall carry out Research and Training programs with the focus on Sri Sathya Sai Sahitya (literature). The Sri Sathya Sai Sahitya covers the key contents of almost all the major spiritual texts and philosophies from around the world.

The objective of the Sri Sathya Sai Centre for Human Values is

“To foster the Study of Sri Sathya Sai Literature in order to promote a holistic understanding of a spiritual life and living.”

By the divine grace and guidance of Bhagawan, the Centre this year was able to take up many programmes in Prasanthi Nilayam as well as reaching out beyond. Some of the highlights of this year are as follows:

During the past year, the Centre took up the following programs:

AIS Training Program

The Training Division of Department of Personnel and Training, Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, Government of India, New Delhi, solicited a proposal for conducting a “One weeklong In-Service training program for Officers of All India Service (IAS, IPS and IFoS) and Officers working under Central Staffing Scheme in the Govt. of India”. In response, SSSCT proposed a program Titled HUMAN VALUES IN GOVERNANCE AND PUBLIC POLICY to be conducted by SSSCHV. The proposal was accepted, and the program was conducted from Jan 03 to Jan 07, 2022 in Prasanthi Nilayam with all the COVID protocols being followed. Of the many officers nominated, only 12 could attend this program due to non-release from the parent unit of the states concerned.

Proposed objectives of this program are:

- Emphasising the role Human Values play in personal and professional excellence
- Examining a model developed and practised by SSSCT through its service institutions in the two sectors – Education and Medical care.

The participants were exposed to concepts and inputs through presentations and discussions with experts from our own institutions and eminent guest speakers.

Visits were organised to SSSIHL, SSSIHMS and also along with the Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Hospital to the villages where medical care was being

provided. The objective of these field visits was for the participants to observe and interact with the various stakeholder and understand how Human Values are being practised.

The program was well received and was given high ratings by the participants.



Human Values in Governance and Public Policy – AIS Training organised by SSSCT

Sri Sathya Sai Pragathi Patham Program for Samithi Office-bearers

This very successful program for Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations – India (SSSSO-I) conducted for All India President (AIP), State Presidents (SP), District Presidents (DP) and state and district level office-bearers was suitably customised for Samithi Office-bearers and active workers.

Both Ladies and Gents office-bearers participated in day-long programs conducted in the vernacular language of the state. During the pandemic, this program was conducted online, and as the restrictions were eased, the program was offered in person, at the samithi level itself.

To date over 900 Samithis and more than 22,500 members have been covered by this program.



Inauguration of the New Premises of Sri Sathya Sai Centre for Human Values

With the blessings of Bhagawan, SSSCHV moved into a modern and utility-oriented new facility. It was inaugurated on Feb 28, 2022. The premises houses a modern facility for conducting lectures and programs online, a library, a committee room, workspace for about 20 members of staff and volunteers. The facility is located above the western canteen and adjoining Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini.



Website Launch

The official web pages of SSSCHV were launched on Mar 04, 2022. The website hosts quotations, articles, podcasts and videos based on the teachings of Bhagawan. Broadly, the areas covered include Samskruti (culture), Sadhana (spiritual practice), Siksha (education), Satgunas (human values) and Samaikyata (unity of faith).
