There are many Trusts functioning under the name of 'Sri Sathya Sai Trust (Name of the state)'. In seven of these Trusts functioning in the states of Bihar, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana & Chandigarh, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Karnataka, the Central Trust has powers to nominate the trustees. In all the other State Trusts, new trustees are appointed by the existing trustees. There are some Sai Trusts and Foundations functioning overseas which are independent bodies and the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust has no legal connection with them though all are connected through the Divine inspiration of Bhagawan Baba.

All contributions to the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust are voluntary from individuals who witness Bhagawan Baba's various projects being executed efficiently, their positive impact on beneficiaries and their providing relief to a large number of people. Report of Activities 2022-23



The Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust (SSSCT) is a unique institution. It is a Public Charitable Trust whose objectives are service to the needy, through activities in the fields of health, education and public utility. Bhagawan has set up landmark institutions and projects with very innovative models for efficient functioning and effective utilisation of resources. The Trust completed 50 years of service to mankind this year. The trust was founded by Bhagawan on September 02, 1972, and ever since it has been Baba's instrument, translating into action His message of selfless love, thereby touching the lives of millions.

The Trustees have been ensuring that these continue to work in the same efficient manner, in the same spirit of inspiration and dedication. There were five Board meetings between Apr 01, 2022 and Mar 31, 2023.

In the year under review, the Trust signed an MoU with the Government of Andhra Pradesh to feed the school students Ragi Malt. The Trust agreed to provide Ragi Flour and Jaggery Powder for making the nutritious healthy drink (Ragi Jawa) to be served in the schools in the morning sessions to about 38 lakh students (3.8 million students) studying from Classes I to X in about 44,392 Schools spread in 679 mandals across 26 districts of Andhra Pradesh.

The 'Sri Sathya Sai Divyasmrti', a unique digital museum on the life, mission and message of Bhagawan was set up in the Brindavan Ashram to commemorate the Golden Jubilee of the Sri Sathya SaiCentral Trust. The purpose of this digital museum is to inspire goodness and idealism in the current generation. It brings together archive footage and images of Bhagawan, re-creation through digital art and animation, facets of Bhagawan's life and presenting His timeless message through modern methods of presentation. The museum was inaugurated by the then Hon'ble Chief Minister of Karnataka, Sri Basavaraj Bommai on November 03, 2022. The museum which was set up by the Trust with an outlay of approximately ₹5 Crores, has had a very good response from devotees and visitors to the Ashram. Close to seven thousand people visited the museum between Nov 2022 and Mar 2023.

The Trust continued its support to all other allied institutions with timely upgradation of facilities, manpower and equipment to ensure the smooth functioning as per the mission of the institutions. A state-of-the-art Optical Coherence Tomography (OCT) machine worth ₹60 lakhs was procured and installed at the SSSIHMS-Prasanthigram. OCT is a non-invasive imaging method that can be used to diagnose and manage diseases like diabetes-related retinopathy and glaucoma.

The Trust continued improving the facilities for devotees visiting Prasanthi Nilayam and permanent residents. The main roads around the Mandir, used for Nagarsankirtan were relaid using the best practices considered in the International Road Congress. The streetlights in the Ashram have been augmented to ensure all public spaces are well-lit. Additional safe drinking water dispensers have been installed at different places in Ashram for the convenience of the devotees.

The Trust facilitated the setting up of a Sound and Light Show on the Divine Life and Message of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba at the Sri Sathya Sai Hill View Stadium. This is an initiative by the Ministry of Tourism, Govt. of India and implemented by India Tourism Development Corporation. The Trust provided support in terms of content creation and other logistics. The Show was launched on November 22, 2022 in the presence of Sri G Kishan Reddy, Hon'ble Minister for Tourism, Culture and DoNER, Govt. of India, Smt R K Roja, Hon'ble Minister of Tourism, Culture & Youth Advancement, Govt. of AP and other dignitaries.

On Bhagawan's 97th Birthday, the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust along with the Sri Sathya Sai Global Council launched 'Sri Sathya Sai Prema Tharu' an initiative to plant 10 million trees as our offering to Bhagawan for His 100th Birthday. To track and facilitate this green mission, a web app developed by the Sri Sathya Sai Media Centre was inaugurated on Maha Shivaratri morning on Feb 18, 2023, so that every person who plants a tree can register their tree, geotag it and track its growth. The app also helps to get an overview of how this noble mission is progressing globally on a daily basis.





Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Learning in association with the Satish Dhawan Space Centre SHAR, Sriharikota, ISRO, and the Department of Space, Government of India, celebrated the World Space Week 2022 in October. The World Space Week 2022 is being observed at 8 different venues across 4 states with 'Space & Sustainability' as the theme, and Prasanthi Nilayam was chosen as one of the venues. The inaugural ceremony of the same was held at the Sri Sathya Sai International Centre for Sports, Prasanthi Nilayam and was presided over by His Excellency, Sri Biswabhushan Harichandan, Hon'ble Governor of Andhra Pradesh and Sri A Rajarajan, Distinguished Scientist & Director, SDSC SHAR, ISRO.

The Trust continued to support and mentor the activities of the Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations, India (SSSSO) and the Sri Sathya Sai Global Council (SSSGC). The SSSSO organised Sadhana Shibirs (Reorientation Camps) for various groups such as Samiti Convenors, Youth, State and District Office-bearers and Mahilas at Prasanthi Nilayam. Apart from this, devotees from various states and districts visited Prasanthi Nilayam as part of their Parthi Yatra. Similarly, groups from various countries of SSSGC also visited the Ashram and all these groups and programs were supported by the Trust and its various wings to make the stay of the devotees and participants pleasant and purposeful.





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AUDITOR'S REPORT

ii) In the case of Income & Expenditure Account, of excess of income over expenditure for the year ended on that date.





Compliance & Social Impact

Our books of accounts are regularly audited by an eminent firm of auditors. Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust has consistently adhered to procedures of regulatory compliance required by various departments of the government. The Trust files income tax returns every year and responds promptly to any follow-up gueries by the Income Tax Department. Reports required under Foreign Contribution Regulation Act, 2010 are regularly submitted to the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India. The Trust has been filing a copy of the annual financial statements along with the statement giving details of additions / deletions to the assets of the Trust, with the District Endowments Officer, Puttaparthi every year as per subsection 10 of section 43 of the Andhra Pradesh Charitable & Hindu Religious Institutions and Endowments Act, 1987. The Trust has been prompt and timely in its history of compliance.

Social Impact: In the last couple of years, Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust has installed rooftop solar power panels in a conscious move towards green sources of power. These solar panels have been installed at the two super–speciality hospitals, the hostels of the educational institutions in Prasanthi Nilayam campus, and on various buildings in the ashram. This has led to a saving of ₹ 21.24 crores in electricity bills upto March 2023.

The Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust has been offering free medical care to the needy through two General Hospitals and two Super-speciality Hospitals. The Trust also runs, as part of the medical outreach program, a Mobile Hospital. During the current year, the benefit to society

through medical costs saved by patients treated at the two Super–speciality Hospitals is estimated at ₹ 148.3 Crores (computed at CGHS rates), and since inception the amount is a staggering ₹ 3,431 Crores. If the market cost of treatment at hospitals of comparable level of sophistication in equipment and medical services were to be considered, the savings realized would be far higher than these figures.

Similarly, the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust runs educational institutions from primary to secondary levels and supports undergraduate, post graduate courses and Ph.D. degrees, providing contemporary and quality academic programs with value orientation. This again is totally free to the students. The total number of students studying in all these institutions together is 4,358 (3,055 in schools and 1,303 in University). In addition, the Trust supports schools run by state Trusts or societies in different parts of the country.



Sociocare

Ragi Malt (Ragi Jawa) Initiative:

The Government of Andhra Pradesh has initiated a welfare program of providing Mid-Day Meals (MDM) to school-going children which is known as 'Jagananna Gorumudda'. The program aims to ensure enrolment, retention and attendance while simultaneously improving the nutritional levels of children studying in Class I to Class X in all the Government, Local body and Governmentaided schools.

With the aim to create awareness and increase the production and consumption of millets, the year 2023 has been declared by the United Nations as the 'International Year of the Millet', at the behest of the Government of India.

To enhance the nutrition quotient of the students, the Government of Andhra Pradesh decided to include Ragi Malt (Finger Millet) as a breakfast item for 3 days a week. Ragi Malt is prepared with 10 gms of Ragi Flour and 10 gms of Jaggery Powder cooked in 150 ml of hot water. This delicious drink is rich in various nutrients like iron, calcium, protein, carbohydrates and so on. The drink is prepared in the schools and provided to the children before the classes begin.

Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust came forward to undertake the supply to the entire state of Andhra Pradesh. The required quantities of Ragi Flour and Jaggery Powder for this program are provided free of cost. 38 lakh students studying in about 44,392 schools in 26 districts of Andhra Pradesh are benefitted.

Solar Power Plants:

The Trust has taken huge initiatives in the last few years through the Sri Sathya Sai Mitra Project towards powering the Institutions through Solar Power moving away from conventional energy sources. Since 2018, under Phase 1, Phase 2 and Phase 3 of the Project, Solar plants of 6.24–MWp capacity were installed at various institutions of the Trust at an approximate cost of ₹28 Crore.

Up to March 2023, these plants have generated 284 lakh units of green power leading to a saving of ₹21.24 crores in electricity bills. The plants installed in Phase 1 have paid back the initial investment. This is a unique green initiative by the Trust.

Kerala – The construction of Anganwadis has been taken up in the flood affected district of Alappuzha. Anganwadis are schools for toddlers or nursery children. In these centres, the children are provided with nutritious food along with basic learning. In order to secure the tiny tot's physical and educational aspects Kerala Government had requested for these anganwadis to be built in the flood-ravaged district. These centres have classrooms, kitchen and washrooms. 9 anganwadi centres are built in the district. The sizes of the centres being built are dependent on the number of children in the locality. Two large (approx. 6000 sq.ft.) and seven smaller ones (approx.4000 sq.ft.) are being constructed. These will be handed over to the Govt by the end of this month. Few of these are located in areas that are not connected by motorable roads. This makes the construction challenging as construction material cannot be easily transported. But these are the most deserving of all. Swami's Grace flows to those whom others find difficult to reach.

Odisha – The absence of safe drinking water leads to many health conditions that are preventable. Typically in fluoride-contaminated areas and saline areas pure drinking water is a boon for the population. In the coastal district of Kendrapada of Odisha there is high salinity in the ground water. The Trust has installed 2 drinking water plants in two remote hamlets of this district. The backward district of Nuapada in Western Odisha is fluoride-affected. The residents suffer from fluoride related medical conditions. To alleviate their distress the Trust has provided 5 plants in remote hamlets that need potable drinking water.



Savings to Patients*

Introduction

In recent years, several advances have been made in the fields of Medical Sciences and Technology. While medical facilities have increased manifold, the prohibitive cost of quality healthcare (being highly capital and skill intensive) has taken many of these Life-saving measures out of the reach of the common man. In response to this situation, Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba set up hospitals to provide highest level of healthcare to all patients free of all charges.

The Sri Sathya Sai Hospitals perform thousands of advanced surgeries each year totally free of cost without any discrimination of caste, creed or economic status. Nearly 66% of the patients treated at the two super–speciality hospitals are those whose family annual income is less than ₹ 30,000 p.a. In this way, they bring a smile to the faces of economically distressed section of the masses for whom access to quality healthcare would have otherwise remained a distant dream.

Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences, Prasanthigram

The Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences (SSSIHMS), Prasanthigram, Puttaparthi continues to maintain high standards of patient care by providing completely free treatment to all in-patients and out-patients irrespective of caste, creed, race, religion, ethnicity and nationality. The completely free treatment includes diagnosis, surgery, interventions, medicines and diet.

During the past year, 1,26,180 outpatient consultations were performed.

During the year under review, 9,269 surgeries and procedures were carried out by the departments of CTVS, Cardiology, Urology, Plastic Surgery, Ophthalmology and Orthopaedics put together and 8,22,292 diagnostics tests were performed.

New Equipment and Facilities

New OCT Machine inauguration

With the Blessings of Bhagawan, a new state-of-the-artOptical Coherence Tomography (OCT) machine worth ₹60 lakh was inaugurated at the Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences, Prasanthigram, Puttaparthi.

The OCT machine was inaugurated by Sri RJ Rathnakar, Managing Trustee of SSSCT, in the presence of Dr Gurumurthy, Director of SSSIHMS, Prasanthigram, Dr Anuj Sharma, Head of the Department of Ophthalmology and other senior staff members of the hospital.

Optical coherence tomography (OCT) is a non-invasive imaging method that uses reflected light to create pictures of the back of your eye.

It can be used to diagnose and manage diseases like diabetes-related retinopathy and glaucoma.

Manufactured by Carl Zeiss, the OCT machine has many advanced features like Enhanced Depth Imagine (EDI) through which the machine can analyse beyond the layers of the retina. Also, the system comes with a Fast–Track feature which helps in reducing the eye motion artifacts and thereby improving the accuracy of the diagnosis.



Academics

As of Mar 31, 2023, 35 Postgraduate students were undergoing training to pass the All-India examination to qualify for obtaining the Certificate of Diplomate of National Board in various disciplines approved by the National Board of Examinations, New Delhi, which also includes super-specialities in medical sciences viz., Cardio Thoracic and Vascular Surgery, Cardiology, and Urology and sub-specialities of Ophthalmology, Anaesthesiology and Orthopaedics.

Achievements

Research paper on Avascular Necrosis of Femoral Head in Adults by Department of Orthopaedics receives All India Gold Medal

Dr Prakash Khanchandani, the Head, Department of Orthopaedics, SSSIHMS, Prasanthigram, has received a gold medal for his presentation on Integrated Systems Analysis of Avascular Necrosis of Femoral Head in Adults: Clinical Relevance, Critical Pathways, potential mechanisms, biomarkers and Therapeutic Targets. The Gold medal was presented for the prestigious Dr Balu Sankaran Oration on Basic Science and Orthopaedic Research by the Indian Orthopaedic Association, during the Annual Conference held from December 1–3, 2022 at Amritsar, Punjab.

The presentation is a result of around 10 years of Collaborative Research between the SSSIHMS, Prasanthigram and the Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Learning, Prasanthi Nilayam. The research involved an Integrated Systems Biology approach to unravel the mysteries of Avascular Necrosis of the Femoral Head in adults and has been published twice in the internationally acclaimed journal of Scientific Reports, Nature and will be soon implemented in the treatment protocols.

The impact of this research can change the treatment protocol for this debilitating disease, thereby increasing the positive outcome of regenerative treatment in young patients, who are usually breadwinners of society, thereby having a great social impact. The ground-breaking research and the results were widely appreciated by the National and International faculty members at the conference.

Certificate & Gold Medal of Dr Prakash Khanchandani

Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences, Whitefield (Bengaluru) a 333-bedded Super Speciality Hospital continues its service to society offering the best medical care to patients from across the country and abroad. During the last year, the institution saw nearly 87,853 patients in the super-speciality departments of Cardiac Sciences and Neurosciences, performing more than 6,426 surgeries/procedures. Since its inception, the hospital has performed 1,32,709 surgeries/ procedures and has provided over 16,18,485 outpatient consultations. Throughout the year Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust has upgraded several equipment at the hospital.

1. State-of-the-art Echocardiography machines Vivid E95 R3 and GE T8 Ultra from M/s GE Healthcare

2. Advanced Patient Monitoring Systems for Cardiac and Neuro Operating Rooms and ICUs. A total of 28 monitors were procured from M/s Nihon Khoden, Japan by SSSCT to provide advanced patient monitoring capabilities in the Operating Rooms and ICUs

3. Advanced ventilators – 3 Nos. from M/s GE Healthcare

4. CUSA (Cavitron Ultrasonic Surgical Aspirator) from M/s Soering is a very critical equipment used in the Neurosurgery Department. CUSA is required for excision of large cranial (brain) tumours like gliomas, CP Angle, Posterior fossa lesions and some meningiomas 5. Intraoperative Ultrasound system from M/s Mindray for accessing delicate veins in small babies and to scan the tumours intraoperatively in the Neurosurgery Department

6. Mobile DR X-ray system to take bedside X-rays in the Intensive Care Units

7. Ride-on Scrubber dryer from M/s Roots India for cleaning the vast corridors

8. ETO sterilizer for sterilizing critical instruments used in the Operating room

9. Two ABG analysers from M/s Techno Medica

10. Mindray Ultrasound MX7

11. Hyper-Hypothermia Equipment for Heart Lung Machine

12. Hettich Rotosilenta Centrifuge

On the academic front too, the hospital had lots to cheer about. In recognition of the excellent instruction provided by the doctors of our hospital, the National Board of Examinations has selected SSSIHMS, Whitefield, as a DNB Examination Centre for Cardiology, Cardiac Surgery and Anaesthesia. The doctors of the hospital have made presentations at several National and International conferences and have also conducted conferences at the hospital for the benefit of post-graduates in Cardiology and Cardiac Surgery.

Sri Sathya Sai General Hospital, Whitefield (Bengaluru)


This 80-bed general hospital is operated through a unique model that involves significant volunteering by honorary doctors along with in-house doctors. Nearly 2954 surgeries were performed, and more than 1.20 lakh patients received treatment in the previous year.

The General Surgery department upgraded its laparoscopic equipment facility consisting of a 4K imaging system (Olympus) which is used to carry out laparoscopic surgeries.

The Obstetric department upgraded its diagnostic equipment, which is used for monitoring foetal heart rate, and the NST

machine with GE Corometrics 172 & 171 series, which can be used for twin babies monitoring. The OPG equipment is a panoramic scanning dental X-ray of the upper and lower jaw. An Acteon product, where images are directly stored in PACS servers and can be viewed in any of the hospital networked systems, thereby removing the need for any prints of the dental X-ray images.

Apart from regular surgeries, major laparoscopic surgeries are now being carried out at SSSGH-Whitefield. With laparoscopic work, the average surgical and medical cost is significantly reduced.

Sri Sathya Sai General Hospital, Prasanthi Nilayam

Sri Sathya Sai General Hospital is the first medical institution started by Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba in 1956. It continues to provide quality, primary and secondary medical care and also facilitates patient's referral to centres of tertiary medical care. The services have increased in quantum and spectrum, after Puttaparthi was declared as Sri Sathya Sai District in April 2022.

- On average, the daily outpatient service catered to 800 to 1000 patients. The Department of Emergency Medicine was recently renovated and re-designed to have 3 distinct sections namely (i) Triage, (ii) Observation and (iii) Emergency Admission, at a cost of ₹4.11 lakh.
- The Hospital is managed by 34 Doctors, 59 Nursing Staff and 53 Supporting Staff. In addition, a number of Doctors of different specialities come from both overseas and different parts of the Country and render voluntary service for varying periods.
- At least 3 patients were treated every day for snake bites, and the full range of treatment from Anti-Snake Venom to blood coagulation



preparation is always available and provided to the patients.

- A special Lifestyle Clinic has been providing its services to patients with diseases like Diabetes, Hypertension, Stroke and Heart Disease, and it is manned by an Honorary Senior Consultant, Senior Medical Officer and Dietician.
- The ENT service is now comprehensive as all relevant surgeries are performed and the full-fledged audiology lab set up last year has enhanced the services.
- The General Hospital continues to provide

its Operation theatre, Nursing staff, and drugs, for the Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Hospital, Prasanthi Nilayam for General Surgery, ENT, Gynaecology and Oncology Patients.

 The Hospital is also recognised by the National Board of Examinations in Medical Sciences, New Delhi for Post Graduate Course in Family Medicine. There are 6 residents at any given time and the pass percentage every year has been nearly 100%.



Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Hospital, Prasanthi Nilayam

Bhagawan inaugurated in March 2006, the Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Hospital which takes top-quality, secondary-level healthcare right to the rural doorstep. The hospital, a Siemens Sanjeevani, is equipped with diagnostic services including, X-ray, ECG, 2-D Echo, Ultrasound and Pathology. Every month, for twelve days, the mobile clinic with its team of doctors visits a village every day, offering diagnostic services and even performing minor surgeries and dental procedures. Where urgent medical attention is necessary, the patients are referred to local Sri Sathya Sai hospitals for further treatment, where volunteer surgeons serving with Mobile Hospital are also involved in performing surgeries for these patients. This has led to an increase in the number of surgeries of all specialities for the needy and greater voluntary involvement by reputed surgeons from all over Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. A Chronic Disease Programme maintains a regular treatment protocol for patients with diseases like Diabetes, Hypertension, Epilepsy etc.

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


Introduction

Unique Activities / Initiatives at School

Art and Skill Enrichment Program:

- With a view to bring out and enrich the hidden art and skill in the students, the ASEP was introduced in the year 2013.
- It is a collaborative program organized with the help of experts in various fields of Art from Music College, Prasanthi Nilayam which includes nearly 20 experts in various fields teaching our students.
- The program includes training in the following areas of art and skill: Carnatic and Hindustani Vocal, Keyboard, Harmonium, Violin, Veena, Sitar, Tabla, Dance, Yoga, Gymnastics, etc.
- Even though this is a program characterized by voluntary participation, an astonishing number of around 200 students across all the classes have enrolled and are currently undergoing training and deriving the benefits from this program.

Below is the Highlights of the result of the class X and XII Board examinations conducted by the CBSE Board:

- The school had an impressive average of 87.6% in the X Board exams, with 87 of the 89 students clearing with distinction and 41 of them securing above 90%

- Of the 114 students who appeared for the XII Board exams, 104 cleared with distinction and 56 secured marks above 90%. The school average was at an impressive 87%

Smt Eswaramma High School

One may say that the foundation to Bhagawan's Educational Mission was laid by the Divine Mother Eswaramma, when she requested Swami to start a small school in the village for the children. Keeping character development with academic excellence as its governing principle, Smt Eswaramma High School started humbly in the 'Patha Mandiram' in 1972. The school had Telugu as the medium of instruction and was under the State Board of Andhra Pradesh catering to the local children. In the year 2010, the school was affiliated with CBSE, New Delhi, with English as the medium of instruction, and continues to cater to the local children. On July 20, 2022, the School celebrated its Golden Jubilee with a special program in the Sai Kulwant Hall.

Over the years, our school has consistently achieved remarkable academic and co-curricular results, making a significant impact on the holistic development of our students. Like all other institutions of Bhagawan, education is provided totally free of cost. The management spends an estimated amount of \gtrless 40,000 on each student per year. The school administration is pleased to announce its upgrade to classes 11 and 12 with

The Deemed-to-be-university hosts students from across the country at its four campuses in AndhraPradeshandKarnataka,India,andprovides free education to all programmes of study. 
Actuarial Data Science Team Participates in the Global Conference of Actuaries, 2023, New Delhi

General Public Utility

Convention Centre:

Sai Hira Global Convention Centre was virtually inaugurated by the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, Sri Narendra Modiji on July 4, 2023.

The Convention Centre would host national and international conferences of office bearers of the Sai Movement and inspire community leadership among them for the furtherance of the Sai Mission. It is expected to become the hub of mutual sharing regarding the Practice of Human Values, Indian Culture, Philosophy and Tradition as a way of life. It would help young groups to collectively deliberate on various seva activities in their respective regions as well as host youth-related programs such as the National Leadership Programme. In the past, Prasanthi Nilayam has hosted some unique conferences around specific themes, such as the Go-Green conference, Veda conference, Conference on Human Values in Police Force, Conference on Ethics in Finance etc. With the launch of this convention centre, this state-of-the-art facility will go a long way in facilitating these activities.

The building has a built-up area of approximately 55,000 sq.ft. having two auditoria of 300 & 1000 seater respectively. It also has a conference hall with a seating capacity of 40 participants, fully equipped with state-of-the-art audio & video systems.

The Kalzip–Germany roofing sheets are moulded at the site and then laid in order to have the least number of joints. The design allows for the mounting of solar panels too. The building has been provided with a 220kWp solar plant that will meet its power requirements.

The stage of the 300 seater is 50' x 18' and the 1,000 seater is 60' x 40'. Both the auditoria are provided with LED screens. The stages are provided with suspended wooden flooring that allows for zero carriage of vibrations and is best suited for classical dance performances too. The stage of the 1,000 seater can hold a symphony orchestra of 50 members.

The auditoria are equipped with audio systems from L-Acoustics, France, industry leaders in the design, manufacturing, and distribution of premium sound reinforcement technologies.


Inauguration of Sri Sathya Sai Divyasmrti

Commemorating the Golden Jubilee of the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust, a Digital Museum was set up on the life, message and work of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba – 'Sri Sathya Sai Divyasmrti'. This is the first of its kind museum to be set up by any spiritual organisation. Bhagawan's life is filled with inscrutable divine occurrences and lessons for mankind. In His lifetime, He travelled extensively across India, touching millions of individuals from different strata of society, and initiating social welfare measures that remain unmatched to this day. Millions across the globe venerate Him as the Avatar of the age and continue to experience His presence and blessings in their lives. This digital museum is an attempt to capture and present this saga of selfless love and service and inspire goodness and idealism in the current generation. The museum brings together archive footage and images, re-creation through digital art and animations and other such contemporary methods of presentation. The museum is situated within the Brindavan Campus at Kadugodi, Bengaluru and is open to all public free of charge.



The museum was inaugurated by the then Chief Minister of Karnataka, Sri Basavaraj Bommai on November 3, 2022. The museum is spread over 4,850 sq.ft. The Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust commissioned the project for the benefit of devotees visiting the Campus and as a means to introduce the legacy and selfless work of Bhagawan to those unaware of His life. The project was executed by the Sri Sathya Sai Media Centre, Prasanthi Nilayam, with support from Tagbin, the company that worked on projects such as the prestigious Pradhanmantri Sangrahalaya, G20 Digital Experience Centre.







The museum has been extremely well received, leaving devotees moved and visitors new to Swami overwhelmed with the incredible life and grand works of the Avatar. Between the inauguration on Nov 03, 2022 and Mar 2023, 6,685 people have visited the museum.

Sri Sathya Sai Chaitanya Jyoti Museum:

Chaitanya Jyoti Museum (Life and Mission of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba) was inaugurated on 18th November 2000 by Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba. Since inauguration of the museum 55,54,647 (as on 31st Oct 2023) visitors visited the museum.

In the year 2022–23, the museum had 1,63,463 visitors.

Sri Sathya Sai Space Theatre:

The Sri Sathya Sai Space Theatre, inaugurated by Bhagawan in 1985 is the only Planetarium between Bengaluru and Hyderabad in this part of India. Since the Planetarium is located in a rural area, special emphasis is placed on creating shows in the local language, Telugu. Since Prasanthi Nilayam has visitors from all over India and the world, headsets are provided to the visitors so that they can hear the show in the language of their choice (Hindi, Telugu, Malayalam and English).

Between Apr 15, 2022 and Apr 01, 2023, the space theatre had 74, 660 visitors.





Sri Sathya Sai Media Centre

The Sri Sathya Sai Media Centre (SSSMC) began its journey as Radio Sai Global Harmony, a satellite radio service in 2001 when Bhagawan launched it during His birthday celebration.

When Bhagawan inaugurated the studio facility of Radio Sai in 2002, He clearly explained that there was nothing for Him to gain through a media outreach unit; He was pleased as long as devotees were served. He had given a simple formula – when knowledge is used for the benefit of others, it becomes a skill, and it brings balance and insight.

21st Anniversary

As part of the celebrations, the members and volunteers of the SSSMC presented programs on Aug 28, 2022, at the Sai Kulwant Hall. Following a music program by volunteers from the State of Kerala, 'Sri Sathya Sai Madhuravani' – a new Malayalam YouTube Channel was then launched in the Divine Presence. This is the fifth vernacular YouTube Channel of SSSMC after Telugu, Hindi, Tamil and Kannada.

In the evening, the members of SSSMC made a unique presentation in the form of a Quiz Program entitled – Sri Sathya Sai Jeevanamrutam, on the Life and Message of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba in Sai Kulwant Hall.

Sound and Light Show

SSSMC helped in putting together, reviewing and enhancing the content of the Sound and Light Show set up by the Ministry of Tourism, Govt. of India and implemented by India Tourism Development Corporation. 
Sri Sathya Sai Divyasmṛti


YouTube Silver Creator Award for 'Prasanthi Mandir Live' Channel



Sri Sathya Sai Official YouTube Channel Views by Age



Integral Education For All, By All

The Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini (SSSVV) Project is one of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba's living legacies to guide the education of future generations. The program marks its 13th anniversary in November 2023.

After setting up India's top schools and a multi-campus university, Bhagawan Baba decided to extend the advantages of Sai education to children everywhere. This was to bridge the ever-widening gap between India and Bharat, made conspicuous by the numeracy and literacy disparities between rural and urban children. Towards this end, He set up SSSVV as the digital platform to empower teachers everywhere and democratised access to high-quality content, training, teaching aids, communicative English for vernacular speakers, Inclusive education and much more. SSSVV is the world's largest and only philanthropy-driven EdTech project that covers the 360 degrees of the digital learning spectrum.

Currently, SSSVV serves the nation's teachers across every district of the country by sharing its digital content via the Honourable Prime Minister's digital gateway, VidyaDaan, to publish it on the NCERT-CIET's open-source website diksha.gov.in




Apart from the national level participation, SSSVV's primary focus remains to empower teachers at rural schools, especially those bearing the name of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba, underperforming government schools in Aspirational districts and any other schools that approach for help.

In addition to the thousand-strong volunteers who work remotely, SSSVV's foot soldiers maintain the ground-level personal connection with rural schools.

Other than the individual volunteers, the programme partners with many government agencies and corporates to implement 'Integral Education For All, By All'.

1. Contents

Pedagogy for classroom transactions is created by a network of 100 content authors, mentors and reviewers, along with 138 multimedia volunteers spread around the globe. During the last year, 648 Master Lesson Plans (MLP) were added to the SSSVV content repository across 5 subjects and 8 boards with approximately 9,720 digital assets. The content creation process has





been completed for CBSE Science and Mathematics for grade 9, while the same is near completion for various State Boards. Content creation for Social Studies for classes 6 to 9 for all Boards is in multiple stages of completion. English Grammar for class 5 across boards and EVS (class 5) for one Board is also nearing completion, bringing the total SSSVV content repository to 42,400 digital assets parked on the LMS and freely accessible to all registered users.

The three State Educational Boards of Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat and Karnataka had revised their textbooks, and the new chapters had to be mapped against the existing MLPs. The Learning Management System (LMS) gets updated with these changes regularly for the teachers to access the same. With the implementation of the National Curriculum Framework or NCF 2022, we expect more Boards to change their textbooks shortly.

1. Ideation Module: During the Content Team Meet in Prasanthi Nilayam in January 2023, the Ideation Module approach was introduced to all the content creators and reviewers. It provides pedagogical suggestions for transacting a chapter content as per the NCF 2022. Fifty-five Master Lesson Plans or MLPs were created using this methodology.

Interactive quiz creation: We provide over 63,700 questions covering 1594 chapters across the Boards, subjects and standards.

Graphic Organiser (GO) Posters: Through a CSR initiative, we trained employees of a multinational company to create Graphic Organisers. After reviewing, 452 posters were shared with the in-house Multimedia team to redesign as per SSSVV quality standards. These were printed and dispatched to the schools.

Sahaveeryam Sessions: Since October 2022, the content team has been conducting monthly sessions to share best practices among the content team members. It also serves as a platform to get across new pedagogical approaches/suggestions aligned with the changing pattern as per NCF 2022.

Content Creators Training: A set of 16 new volunteers were inducted to their respective subject teams as content authors after intensive training sessions in the months of March–April 2023.

2. Training

In November 2022, we launched the Continuous Professional Development (SSSVV CPD) Programme for our supported school teachers which has now been made mandatory by CBSE and various State Educational Boards.

The various initiatives and beneficiaries of the SSSVV training include:

Train the Trainers (T3) & Teacher Training (T2) State Level:

Seven state teams have identified 62 prospective trainers, and we have started the hybrid training programme. Training sessions were conducted since November 2022 as part of state level teacher training.

TATVAM Tuesdays by Central Training Team:

TATVAM (Talk, Analyse, Train, Validate, Affirm and Mentor) training for continuous upskilling, mutual learning and being in sync with the emerging trends in training techniques.

Continuous Professional Development (CPD):


The CPD program launched in November 2022, is based on the domains identified by the 'National Initiative for School Heads' and 'Teachers' Holistic Advancement' (NISHTHA) by the Government of India. A baseline assessment of teachers was conducted across all the SSSVV-supported schools.

The SSSVV CPD program is comprised of three main training tracks:

SET (Subject Expertise Training) is a fortnightly online session for teachers which was piloted from Nov 2022 till the closure of schools for summer in April 2023. 600 teachers were trained in all.

TMS (Team Mentored Sessions) & COS (Classroom Observation Sessions): Nominated teachers are provided with a team of mentors that helps them prepare and deliver one 40-minute lesson using the SSSVV's lesson plan format. 80 teachers across 10 states are being mentored currently. 13 teachers from 4 states have benefitted from 22 Trainers, mentors and coordinators.

Self-paced learning courses on the LMS for teachers:



The following are various courses designed in the year 2023.

Lighthouse School Program:

Initiated in January 2023, the objective of this program is to ensure that schools bearing Bhagawan's name are beacons of value-integrated, high-quality education.

In the first phase, 12 schools were shortlisted for the centenary offering, which has been selected based on 23 criteria, including the current engagement of the school with the SSSVV program.

Mission English

The Phone-Your-Friend (PYF) initiative which is conducted as a five-course programme, has been helping innumerable teachers from Sri Sathya Sai Schools, Balavikas Gurus, and Sai youth, as well as students from the Dravidian University and the Rajiv Gandhi University of Knowledge Technologies, Nuzvid, AP.


In order to make this offering available to a larger section of beneficiaries, 'SainIn – the English App' was dedicated at the lotus feet.

English Immersion Programme is a 30-hour programme to empower students in Classes XI and XII to ace the admission and entrance tests conducted by various prestigious institutions, including SSSIHL. SSSSO selects local mentors who are trained by SSSVV.

SOPAAN Training

SOPAAN teacher training program was developed to meet the foundational literacy and numeracy (FLN) needs of the Government schools under NITI Aayog's Aspirational District Programme.

PYF and Sain In mentors and learners across the country



After an excellent start in September 2019 and sustaining the momentum through the pandemic times between 2020 and 2022 in the aspirational district, Virudhunagar in Tamil Nadu and Vidisha in Madhya Pradesh, the journey of implementing the SOPAAN programme has accelerated and is making tremendous progress in the post-pandemic academic year 2022-2023.



3. Teaching Aids

Three types of teaching-learning aids are created and provided – physical aids, multimedia (MM) aids, and Information and Communication Technological (ICT) aids.

4. Inclusive Education Project

The New Education Policy – NEP 2020 envisions making every school in India Inclusive by 2030. The Sustainable Development Goals – 2030 of UNESCO envisage the same. NEP 2020 provides a framework for migrating from physical inclusion to holistic inclusion. SSSVV IEP is developing models and content to help achieve this objective.

Team Building and Motivational Leadership Programme

A Leadership program, which ran from February 11 to March 18, 2023, was conducted with an average attendance of 300 participants.

e-*Pragyan*, a series of online enrichment sessions are conducted once every two months to provide volunteers and professionals with insights into diverse subjects of inclusion, the different types of disabilities and strategies to help children with such disabilities.

Team Training:

The Induction and Training program participants/volunteers were divided into two batches. Each batch underwent three days of the program with around 190 volunteers participating in the program.

An Annual meeting with all the team leaders called 'Success through Synergy' was attended by 45 participants for a duration of 9 hours.

Collaboration with Other Universities:

SSSVV signed an MOA with Avinashilingam Institute for Home Science and Higher Education for Women, Coimbatore University to embed Sign language in the digital content.

Digital Assets:

A fully functional media bank has been created for use by all volunteers across teams. SSSVV IEP has developed its own mascots, named Prem and Shanti, to create a unique connection with the children.

Project Deliverables

SSSVV IE Project is developing digital material to enable Content, Aids and Training across 28 verticals supported by 6 horizontals. These are managed by the Project Management Team under the direction of the Director–SSSVV. In Phase 1, the team is working on 11 verticals.

5. Technology

Harnessing IT to drive the world's largest open-source EdTech project through volunteers:



The new and improved SSSVV website, srisathyasaividyavahini.org was offered at lotus feet on January 21, 2023.

Several additional functionalities required for the Basic level, such as external assessments, autogeneration of Certificates to the learners etc. were built and released in the Android App called 'Sain In – The English App'.

MoUs have also been signed with GCERT (for Gujarat State Board Content), SCERT - Andhra Pradesh (for Andhra Pradesh State Board Content) and with DCERT - Karnataka (for Karnataka State Board Content) in the last year. Content specific to these State Board syllabi is being created and uploaded.

Two years ago, the American accounting firm RSMUS LLP committed to supporting the SSSVV Inclusive Education Project (IEP) as their CSR in India. Since then, nearly 1800 of their employees have produced high-quality content for IEP.

6. SSSVV Partnerships

SSSVV partners with government agencies and corporate houses to translate our motto 'Integral Education For All, By All'into action. We broadly divide these partners into two categories i.e. Contributors and Implementers or Hosts.

Sri Sathya Sai Centre for Human Values

The Sri Sathya Sai Centre for Human Values (SSSCHV) was established as a body that shall carry out Research and Training programs with the focus on Sri Sathya Sai Sahitya (literature). The Sri Sathya Sai Sahitya covers the key contents of almost all the major spiritual texts and philosophies from around the world.

The objective of the Sri Sathya Sai Centre for Human Values is

"To foster the Study of Sri Sathya Sai Literature in order to promote a holistic understanding of a spiritual life and living."

The SSSCHV is deeply grateful to Bhagawan for the opportunity to study, research and propagate His Divine teachings in its own humble way. This fiscal year saw several programs being conducted under the auspices of the SSSCT.

During the past year, the Centre took up the following programs:

Sri Sathya Sai Pragathi Patham (SSSPP) Program for Samithi Office Bearers:

1. For the state of Madhya Pradesh, from April to June 2022, SSSCHV conducted three, one-day long online SSSPP programs for the office bearers at State and District Levels. At the same time, some Samiti-level office bearers also attended these programs.

Simultaneously, several identified members of the state organisation were trained to be the master trainers for the SSSPP Program. They will be conducting this program for office bearers of the remaining samitis. This program's visual aids, write-ups, discourses, etc, have been prepared in Hindi, the language in which most office bearers were conversant.

2. Two batches of the office bearers of the SSSSO, North Karnataka attended the SSSPP Program in Prasanthi Nilayam. These programs were conducted in English and Kannada in the month of May.

3. The program was organised for two batches of the office bearers of the SSSSO, South Karnataka, one each at Brindavan Ashram and Sai Gitanjali in Bengaluru. These programs were conducted in English in the month of April.

4. The program was conducted in English and Tamil for Samiti-level office bearers in Chennai city for SSSSO, Tamil Nadu North and at Madipakkam, for SSSSO, Tamil Nadu South in the month of March.

One-day Program for Teachers:

1. SSSCHV conducted a one-day orientation program on the Philosophy of Sri Sathya Sai System of Integral Education for the teachers of Smt. Easwaramma High School in their premises in Puttaparthi.

2. The same one-day program was also conducted in Prasanthi Nilayam for the teachers of various educational institutions run by Sri Sathya Sai Loka Seva Trust, Alike, Karnataka.

These two programs were conducted in English, during the month of June 2022. The program

covered the fundamental aspects of the Sri Sathya Sai System of Integral Education as well as the role of Teachers in the Sri Sathya Sai Educational System.

Sri Sathya Sai Adhyatma Vidya – Foundation Course:

Starting in July 2022, a new online certificate course, named Sri Sathya Sai Adhyatma Vidya – Foundation Course, was launched with around 90 participants. The course covers in-depth the teachings of Bhagawan Baba on various topics of spirituality with a focus on the '9–Point Code of Conduct' in a structured manner. The course is hosted on a customised Learning Management System (LMS) and consists of multimedia content specially curated and produced for this topic.

Over 70 hours of video and audio content was specifically scripted, recorded and edited with multi-media features, covering Bhagawan Baba's teachings spanning from understanding spirituality to its terminology related to various aspects of Devotional Singing, Prayers, Family Management, Ceiling on Desires, Seva, Sai Literature, Meditation, etc, in 14 weekly modules. This course involves practical methods, assignments, tests and online live interactive sessions between the participants and the faculty.

The second batch of the program with 90 participants, commenced in February 2023 (and was completed by May 2023).

SSSAV Gratitude Program

Universal Human Values course:

The National Education Policy, 2020 has mandated the UGC and AICTE to offer a compulsory threecredit course titled 'Universal Human Values' in all colleges offering technical/professional degrees such as Engineering, Technology, Management and Medicine.

As part of that initiative, Adani University approached the SSSCT to design a UHV program and subsequently train the faculty members (Master Trainers) of the university to take up the teaching of the program in the academic curriculum.

SSSCHV in association with the faculty members of Adani University developed a 30-hour course covering various aspects of the Human Values as relevant to professional students. Subsequently, in the month of September, members of SSSCHV conducted a two-day training/orientation program for all the senior faculty and identified faculty members (Master Trainers) of the Adani University in their premises in Ahmedabad. About 20 faculty members along with the Vice-Chancellor, Controller of Examinations and Deans of Engineering as well as Management and HoDs attended the same.

National Leadership Program of SSSSO:

SSSCHV has taken up a few sessions for the participants of the National Leadership Program conducted by the SSSSO, India. Over 600 participants from two batches attended, the three-day programs conducted in Prasanthi Nilayam. In addition, SSSCHV also participates in conducting a few online sessions from time to time for these batches of participants.



Programs for Sri Sathya Sai Global Council Countries:

SSSPP Program was customised for and offered to around 50 participants including country and regional level office bearers from the countries of Sri Sathya Sai Global Council (SSSGC) Zone 3 (Australia, New Zealand, Fiji Islands and Papua New Guinea). This was held in Prasanthi Nilayam during their one-weeklong Prasanthi Nilayam Pilgrimage in December 2022.


In Jan 2023, the same was conducted online for over 70 office bearers of the SSSGC, Region 3, Zone 1 (USA) during their 2-day annual retreat.

From 23 to 28 Dec 2022, a program entitled 'The Human Values Workshop' was conducted during the annual Prasanthi pilgrimage, for office bearers and devotees of Australia and New Zealand, SSSGC Zone 3 countries. The workshop, which was conducted over five sessions, half-day each was designed as a personalised deep dive into the understanding, expression and practice of Human Values that define an individual. 30 participants attended this workshop.

Re-visiting Sai Literature:

In order to undertake a deeper study of the Sri Sathya Sai Vahinis, a project has been embarked upon, wherein the original manuscripts of the Vahinis are revisited and studied along with the existing translations, to make minor corrections where necessary.
